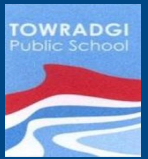
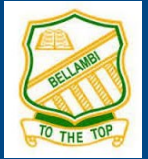

Corrimal CoS: A Leader in 21st Century Learning

Corrimal High School has become a leader within the Illawarra region with regards to 21st Century Learning through the innovative teaching of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). Staff involved in the STEM project received a distinguished award of merit for **Innovation in Teaching and Learning in 2016**.

2016 saw the **Inaugural Corrimal CoS STEM Gala Day**. Teams from the Corrimal CoS participated in a variety of STEM challenges devised by Corrimal High Staff and Students. Challenges included Mars Rover, Bottle Rockets, Mathematics Challenge, Catapults and Wind Turbines.

The winners of the Inaugural CoS STEM Gala Day were Towradgi Public School.

The innovative and engaging way STEM is presented in the Corrimal CoS has resulted in students maximising their learning outcomes in a fun, engaging and interesting way.

All schools competed at a very high level demonstrating outstanding critical thinking and problem solving skills. The project will continue this year with greater participation in interschool STEM competitions such as the Aeronautical Velocity Challenge, FI in Schools, UOW Science Fair, STEM camps, UOW Science and Engineering Challenge and an additional Community of Schools STEM Gala Day involving students in Years 3 and 4.

CHS was proud to host the NSW Department of Education Hearing and Sensory Professional Development Day earlier in Term 1 this year. Close to 100 staff from the Illawarra Education Area engaged in professional development centred around supporting students with identified needs. 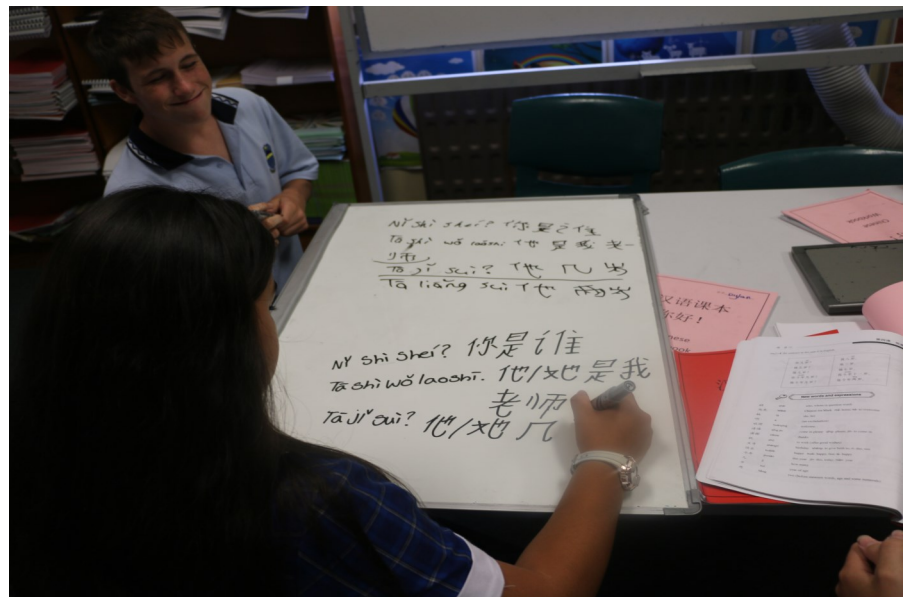

Bump It Up

We are very proud to acknowledge that our school has been identified as a *Bump It Up* school by the NSW Department of Education. The *Bump It Up* strategy focuses on identifying students who are doing well and who, the data suggests, have the greatest capacity to achieve in the top two NAPLAN bands. The *Bump It Up* strategy supports the attainment of the Premiers Priority of 'Increase the proportion of NSW students in the top two NAPLAN bands for Reading and Numeracy by 8% by 2019'.

To support our roll out of *Bump It Up* teachers have begun the professional development in the research-based program, 'Focus On Reading' (FOR). We look forward to seeing the positive outcomes the implementation of FOR strategies has on the reading and comprehension skills of our students.





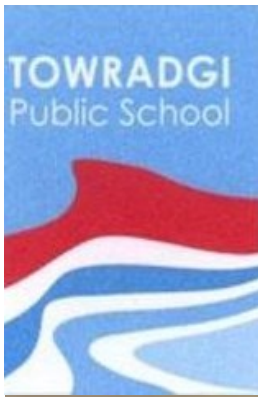
Our Kindergarten of 2017 on their first day at Big School!

BYOD @ Towradgi

As part of Towradgi Public Schools focus on student driven, self-directed learning, students in Years 3-6 have the opportunity to opt-in to the 'Bring Your Own Device' (BYOD) program.

The aim of BYOD is to enable 1:1 access to devices for our students in order to provide them with a wide range of learning tools within flexible learning environments. Students are using their devices to make global connections, access live resources and communicate and collaborate with schools and experts around the world. They are also learning to use their device to share their learning with others in exciting and innovative ways.





Parents as Teachers and Classroom Helpers (PaTCH)

Bellambi Public School understands it is critical we help parents and caregivers understand the important role they play in their children's education. To help improve students' learning our school community has developed the capacity of parents and carers to work in classrooms in support of literacy and numeracy. We have commenced the 2017 school year running the PaTCH program to train and accredit volunteers and provide them with the skills to work in supporting the teaching of reading, writing and early number.

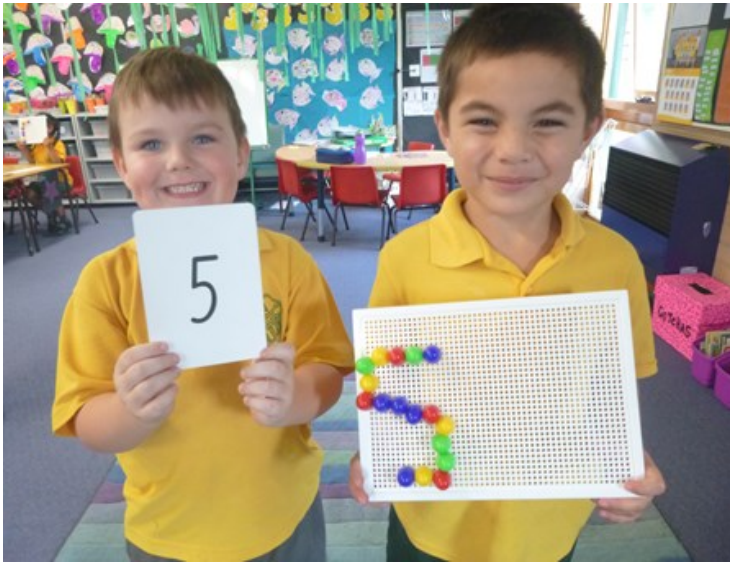
Developing Sport, Developing Minds

She provides quality professional learning in Literacy and Numeracy, follows that up with quality feedback through coaching and mentoring and supports the teachers to analyse data in order to inform teaching and learning programs.

Future Focused Learning: Breakout EDU games

In Breakout EDU games, players work collaboratively to solve a series of critical thinking puzzles in order to open a locked box. Students work in teams to problem solve clues in order to achieve the final goal within a time frame. The skills that the students use to complete these tasks are continually built upon and refined positioning them well to be successful in their future learning and in life in general.
