Catering for All Children's Transition to Big School

The 2017 Early Learning conference is aimed at building connections and networking links between preschool teachers and primary school teachers in our local area. Together the team will discuss, innovate and develop collaborative strategies to support young children in the pre-school to school transitioning phase of their learning journey.

Our talented Early Learning conference team comprises a wealth of experience and expertise. Strategic Direction One: STEM

The Corrimal Community of Schools STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) Leadership Team recognises that our students' futures will include professions that do not exist yet. In fact, it is predicted that in 20 years time 50% of jobs that exist today will no longer exist.

As a Community of Schools, we are committed to setting our students up for success in the real world. This term, the STEM team has focussed on coding. We have given students access to a wide range of programming platforms to meet the needs of beginning coders and extend our advanced coders.

Students have been programming small spherical robots called Spheros. The programming requires students to consider speed, heading (using degree of angle) and time. The aim is for students to make detailed programs, test them and troubleshoot when things go wrong.

In Week 10, teams of 8 of our most committed coders from each primary school will compete at the second 'STEM Gala Day' at Corrimal High School. On this day, students will compete in a variety of events that combine to form the 'Sphero Olympics'. The teams of students will collaboratively code the robots to run, swim and jump. A team from Google headquarters will join us to host a special event programming some brand new robots. The culminating event will be a rocket launch. All events will be designed and coordinated by Corrimal High School STEM class students.

Strategic Direction Two: Successful Transitions

Our purpose of the Successful Transition Strategic Direction is to provide an environment which supports all students to **connect**, **succeed and thrive** at all stages of development and learning. We strive to implement a co-ordinated approach to the Learning and Support Teacher's network, supporting Learning and Support Teachers across all schools, while adhering to the Quality Teaching Framework, School Excellence Framework and the NSWDoE Wellbeing Framework.

Our focus for 2017 is to provide professional learning opportunities for our School Learning Support Officers (SLSOs). These staff members play extremely important roles in engaging students with the curriculum, assisting with classroom activities, school routines and the care and management of students. Specific professional learning opportunities are being rolled out that assist in building authentic and meaningful relationships, building a range of purposeful strategies, skill knowledge and resources which are shared across our schools.



We have designed seven professional learning sessions which are being held throughout 2017. The sessions explore: Roles and Responsibilities, Literacy support, Numeracy support, Sensory Processing, Anxiety, Behaviour and Language Development. We ensure that we are collecting data to evaluate the effectiveness of our practices.

Our CoS is about providing outstanding education for all students. Our team strives to connect knowledge and expertise and form professional relationships building capacity and ensuring continuous improvement across all our schools.

We are learning together and from one another.

Todd Pitchford 'I definitely feel more confident liaising with staff within the school setting. Being able to write my goals in a PDP, and share them, has increased the support from teachers and executive. I feel like I have more direction in my role as an SLSO, which is a good feeling'.

Ebony (Year 5) 'Mr Pitchford helps me with my spelling and fluency in reading. He's always there to support me when I'm not sure about what to do.'

Lena Plakias 'The conferences are informative and I believe the more information we collect from one another, the more SLSOs will become empowered. I have learnt how I can support a child's reading development and my role in the classroom'.

James (Kindergarten) 'Miss Lena helps me write words and she helps me with my handwriting. She helps me with my work and when I find things hard, she helps me'.

CHS Enrichment Class News


