



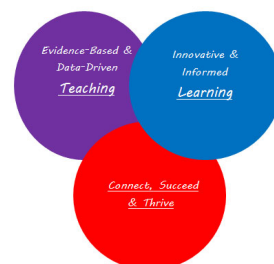

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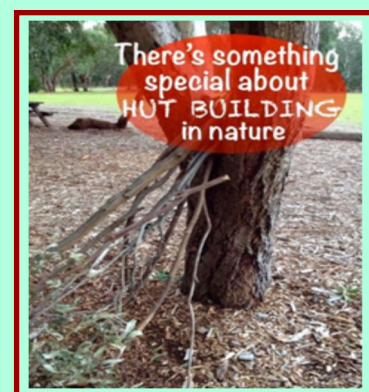

Corrimal East will be continuing with **Trash Free Tuesday** this year. **Every Tuesday** we encourage parents and caregivers to **pack all food in reusable containers with no packaging**. Research shows that nutritious foods aid brain development, concentration and supports healthy immune systems. **Trash Free Tuesday** will also reduce the amount of waste from our school going to landfill.



Updates To Our Attendance Policy

Our school has updated our attendance procedures and it is now inline with changes made to the Department of Education's Policies and procedures.

If your child is away from school you **MUST** call the school to let them know why they are away. If they are absent from school and there hasn't been a call made by the parent/carer then the classroom teacher or office will contact you either on that same day or the following day to ask why your child is away. As soon as your child returns back to school they **MUST** bring an absent note with them and hand it into your child's class slot in the foyer.

ALL students need to be accounted for each and every day. This is why it is extremely important that the school is notified on the day your child is absent from school.

If you have any questions, please speak with your child's class teacher or our friendly office staff.

Entry & Exit from CEPS

Parents are reminded that the small pedestrian gates located on Duff Parade and Pioneer Road are the only entry and exit points from our school. **No one should be using the carpark entry gates nor the bottom driveway gates.** We wish to ensure the safety of our entire school community. Please help us by adhering to these regulations.

The Pioneer Rd gate is locked each day by 9:30am. During the day, the Duff Pde gate is the only entry point. In the afternoons, the duty teacher will walk all students using Pioneer Rd to the gate and ensure they safely cross the road. If a child's pick-up is running late, a phone call to the office is essential. Students are to wait for their pick-up on the admin veranda with a staff member. We wish to ensure the safety and welfare of every child at our school!

*DONATIONS OF HAND SANITISER *

The children are being encouraged to wash their hands throughout the day, including before eating times. We have soap and water facilities both in the classrooms and bathrooms. However we would like to give the students another option to use and believe having hand sanitiser in the classrooms will allow the students to quickly clean their hands when needed. All donations of hand sanitiser can go directly to your child's classroom.

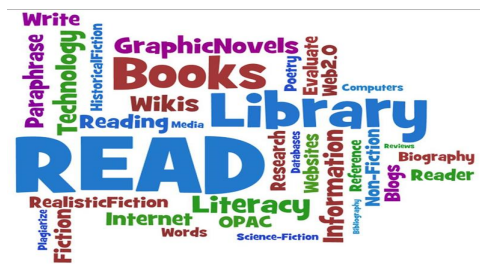

Positive Behaviour for Learning





Overland Park Public School awarded 2020



All staff will frequently give Easties both in the classroom and playground. These will be given as stamps on their individual stamp charts or a physical Eastie. Once a child fills his/her Eastie Chart, he/she will receive an Eastie Award.

The stamp charts will be placed in a box within the classroom. Teachers will record the attainment of awards on their 'Go for Gold Chart'. Class Eastie boxes will be taken to each assembly by classes and placed into the whole school Eastie Box. When full there will be a **whole school reward**. Bronze, silver and gold certificates will be presented to students during the whole school assembly.

Whole School Strategies for Inappropriate Behaviour

In the classroom;

At Corrimal East Public School, all classroom teachers follow a whole-school system of behaviour management.

For inappropriate behaviour, the students will be given their first warning [Warning #1] (yellow). He/she is given a verbal warning at this point and encouraged to display appropriate behaviours and reminded of consequences if inappropriate behaviours continue.

If the inappropriate behaviour continues, the students will be given their second warning [Warning #2] (amber). He/she is given another verbal warning and encouraged to display appropriate behaviours and reminded of consequences if inappropriate behaviours continue.

If inappropriate behaviour continues, the student moves to the 'Time-Out' area of the classroom. Here he/she is taken out of the normal classroom routine. He/she should remain at 'Time-Out' as per his/her age and/or teachers discretion. (Time-Out #1) Teacher will discuss with student appropriate behaviours and how to achieve these. A minor behavior will be recorded on EBS onTrack.

If, once returned to the class setting, inappropriate behaviours continue, the student moves to time-out with an Assistant Principal (or Executive) and a major behaviour slip is completed. AP will discuss behaviours with student. This slip is entered on to EBS onTrack for recording purposes. (Time-Out #2)

In the Playground;

Playground inappropriate behaviors are recorded on the Playground Behaviour Slip (see below). Depending on the severity of the behaviour, students receive a consequence i.e., walking with the teacher whilst on duty, sitting on the silver seats etc.

For serious offences, an Assistant Principal will be called upon to manage.

All Playground Behaviour Slips are recorded on EBS onTrack for recording purposes.

1. If a student receives **3 behaviour slips** (playground and/or classroom) in any 10 week period this action leads to **one Think Tank session** (at the discretion of executive). A formal behaviour letter and return slip will be sent home to the child's parents/carers.

2. If a child receives **another slip (after the initial 3)** (playground and/or classroom) in any 10 week period this action will lead to **two Think Tank sessions** and parents will be contacted and asked for a **formal behaviour review meeting** with the Assistant Principal, classroom teacher and other agencies as needed.

3. If a child receives **another slip (after the 4th)** (playground and/or classroom) in any 10 week period, parents will be contacted and an in-school suspension may occur for two (2) school days (this means the child will go straight to the Principal's office at the end of every class session or will go straight to the Principal's office at the start of the day and remain with him/her for the entire day to complete their set tasks [this is at the Principals discretion].) The student may not be involved in ANY excursions, sporting representations or out of school events for a period of 5 consecutive weeks (maybe overlapping terms) at the discretion of the Principal.

4. If a child receives **6 slips** in any 10 week period, parents will be contacted and a short suspension may be administered. The child may not be involved in ANY excursions, sporting representations or out of school events for period of up to 10 consecutive weeks (maybe overlapping terms) at the discretion of the Principal.

If a child is involved in a 'major' incident, point 4 (above) may be enacted, at the discretion of executive staff.


